Scam warning from Oxfordshire County Council

We've learned of a new scam which is targeting older people in Oxfordshire. The person calling is saying they are from Oxfordshire County Council and are completing a means test

as part of a care assessment.

The assessment is completed on the phone and at the end of it the caller asks for a fee of £150. Means tests are a standard part of an assessment which make this approach particularly credible.

This is not us. If you are contacted to complete a means test over the phone and have any concerns, please call our Adult Social and Health Care Team on 0345 050 7666 select Option 2

We know of one person who has experienced this. Scammers make their living from doing these kinds of things over and over. Please talk to friends and neighbours who might be vulnerable.

New Stained Glass Window for Christ Church Cathedral

For the first time in more than a century, a new stained glass window has been installed in Christ Church Cathedral. The vibrant statement window was designed by celebrated artist John Reyntiens MBE and



produced in London by the world-renowned Reyntiens Glass Studio.

This project was made possible by a generous donation from the barrister Marilyn Kennedy-McGregor. Marilyn has dedicated the window to her late husband, Dr Edward Burn (1922–2019) – a D-Day veteran, barrister, and Official Student and Tutor in Law at Christ Church from 1955 until his retirement in 1990.

At the heart of Christ Church's new window is a depiction of St Francis – patron saint of the environment and animals – who is displayed amid a rich and uplifting natural scene that both evokes Christ Church's gardens and reminds us of our obligations to our planet.

Miles' exhibition theme this year "Wanderlust", from the German word, the desire to travel and he says of his work:

'It is based around the holidays with my wife, before, during and after the lockdown and how much we wanted to get away into the great outdoors. Lots were taken while travelling in a camper van as this was the only way we could ensure that we were sticking to Covid restrictions. It was during these strange times that it became apparent to me that after being stuck in our houses for such a long time we just wanted to get away from our surroundings and see what else there was to see, but within the restrictions of the UK, and not being able to travel abroad.

We travelled sometimes only to Oxford city centre, other times to the further outreaches of Scotland or the south west and east coast.

Some are from before the world changed, but my favourites are when we really knew how glad we were to be outside and enjoying these spectacular views.

Our first Scottish holiday in a camper van was where we saw the beauty of this small island. We were in a campsite with no signal, just like in the olden times. No phone, no internet, just a pack of cards and a cup of tea. It made us realise how lucky we were.



In Cornwall & Devon (Dorset, ed.) we saw the beauty of Durdle Door, In Kent, feeding seagulls was a joy, watching the sunrise over Bournemouth beach gave a new meaning to the morning.


Some of the images, from before Covid, were on holidays that were on

bucket lists. Places to go to, things to see, something outside of the four walls we live in and can touch.

I will continue to add to this collection so that in the future I can remember all the places that we saw, touched and the food we ate there.

My favourite must be the Fairy pools on the Isle of Skye. To actually

capture a Fairy dancing in the water was spectacular. In order to see it I had to precariously climb over several large boulders; balancing on one with my tripod and camera I took the long exposure photo, trying to keep everything steady, while not falling off into the pools below. Oxford Deanery News

The Revd Anthony Buckley, Vicar of St. Michael at the Northgate, Summertown has served as Area Dean for the Oxford Deanery for the past five years. He is stepping down from this role and the Bishop has appointed The Revd Gavin Knight, Vicar of St. Michael and All Angels, Summertown to start as our new Area Dean in June. He will be licensed at the Archdeacon's Visitation Service at the Cathedral on 13th June. (the occasion of the swearing in of churchwardens for this coming year).

In case you are wondering about what a 'deanery' is or does – it is a collection of parishes in a geographical area that work together. Oxford city is split into two deaneries: Oxford and Cowley. Oxford has 19 churches, forming 12 benefices. The deanery is an arm of church government when it meets as the deanery synod.


