Readings for this Sunday:

Numbers 21 4-9 Psalm 107 1-3, 17-22 [Ephesians 2 1-10] John 3 14-21

Dear Friends,

'The people spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness?"

We might feel rather sympathetic to the grumbles of the people of Israel. For many of us it feels like we have been wandering around in a wilderness of infection, fear and isolation for a long time. Most of us, however, have what we need. Food, water, shelter, whereas the people of Israel had real reason to fear for they had no food or water, and the manna that God had provided from heaven was getting boring.

Whatever the facts of their (and our) situations; it remains true that grumbling is pernicious. It is like the venom of a snake that passes through the systems of a body until that body is rendered dead. Grumbling against God or anyone creates negativity that infects our souls, bodies and the communities of which we are apart.

The antidote that Moses offered for snake bites, was an image of a snake displayed on a pole for all who were afflicted to look at. The antidote that the psalmist offers (107.1) is thanksgiving: 'Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good and his mercy endures forever'.

The ultimate antidote to all sin that afflicts the human race is offered to us in the death of Jesus. Jesus, lifted up on the cross as a sacrifice for sin is God's cure for the venom of evil. It is in this faith that we can echo the psalmist's words with assurance:

'Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, and his mercy endures forever.'

Amen to that.



Census day is on March 21, but households will now be receiving letters with online codes explaining how they can complete their forms. If you don't get one in the next couple of weeks, please get in touch with the census contact centre. You can also request a paper questionnaire if you'd prefer to complete your census that way.

There is lots of support available such as a help area on the census website and a contact centre that can give you help over the phone and guidance in a range of languages and accessible formats, including paper questionnaires and large print.

The Office for National Statistics (ONS) runs the census in England and Wales and is independent from the government. All information is held securely for 100 years. Statistics are only compiled based on anonymised data and personal information is not shared with any organisation and is never sold.


